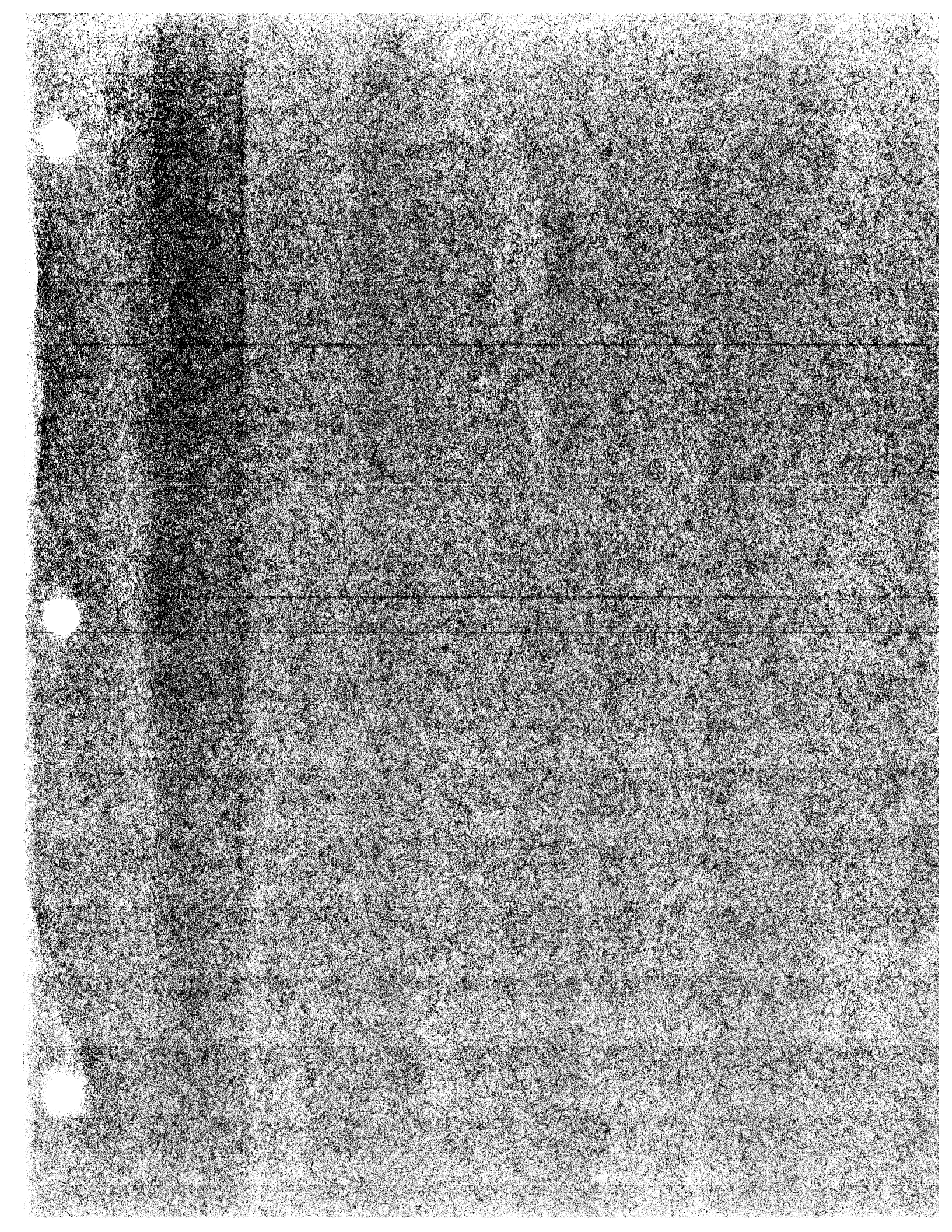

employed at the [REDACTED] late afternoon and evening.

[REDACTED] advised he lived in Newport, NH as a child. In 1981 or 1982 when he was 15 or 16 years old he was hitchhiking from Claremont to Newport and was picked up by a Fr. ROLAND COTE. COTE asked [REDACTED] if he wanted to do some work.

COTE took [REDACTED] a cottage in Unity, NH and he picked up brush and fallen trees from the wooded area. [REDACTED] advised that his father had recently died and each time he went to the cottage he would receive \$40. [REDACTED] advised "the money was good for the family and me."

[REDACTED] advised that the second time he went to do work COTE began by rubbing his leg and gave him a rum and coke to drink. This progressed to COTE "sucking my [REDACTED] dink." [REDACTED] advised that COTE also ejaculated while sucking his dink. [REDACTED] his progressed to they smoking marijuana together. [REDACTED] advised that these acts took place on the couch, the bed or in the Jacuzzi. They would also watch dirty movies that only had men in them. [REDACTED] advised that this took place until he was arrested and incarcerated at the Sullivan County Jail pending bail. He believes this was in 1986 when he was 19 or 20 years old.

[REDACTED] advised that there was one occasion when COTE brought him home and while returned to the cottage COTE went off the road and crashed his car on Unity Rd., Newport, NH. He advised that COTE was under the influence of marijuana at the time.

[REDACTED] advised there were two other priests there that he saw only 2 or 3 times. He did observe them kissing but nothing else.

[REDACTED] advised that the cottage is on a dead end road and the way it curves he is not sure if the cottage is in Newport or Unity, NH.

[REDACTED] advised that he believes Fr. ROLAND COTE was assigned to a St. John's or something near the Canadian Border. He knows that COTE was moved a number of times but did not think anything of it at the time.

[REDACTED] advised that he had reported the incident to the officials at the State Prison but they merely gave him medication. He expected to receive mental health counseling. [REDACTED] advised that he still has nightmares and feels COTE's whiskers scrapping on his balls. [REDACTED] advised that he is currently in treatment.

[REDACTED] advised that his Attorney has a complete chronology that was developed and other information. Requested [REDACTED] contact McGrath and forward a copy to our attention.

Dear [REDACTED] and Attorney McGrath:

On April 17, 2002, this office received notice from N. William Delker, Senior Assistant Attorney General, Criminal Justice Bureau, of allegations by [REDACTED] that he had been sexually assaulted by Father Roland P. Cote in 1981 or 1982. [REDACTED] says he was fifteen or sixteen years old when the first assault took place.

Upon receiving the complaint from Attorney Delker, I assigned this investigation to Newport Police Lt. Jim Brown and New Hampshire State Police Detective Jayson Almstrom. Lt. Brown and Det. Almstrom completed their investigation on May 2, 2002 and the final reports were filed with my office on May 6, 2002.

SUMMARY OF [REDACTED] ALLEGATION

[REDACTED], alleges he was fifteen or sixteen years of age when he met Father Ronald Cote who picked him up while hitchhiking from Newport to Claremont. [REDACTED] says that, on the day of their first meeting, Father Cote offered him employment at his cottage in Newport, New Hampshire hauling brush. [REDACTED] accepted the job offer. [REDACTED] says, that after hauling brush at the cottage, Father Cote offered him a rum and coke which he accepted. Mr.

_____ says that Father Cote then began touching him on the leg which progressed to Father Cote touching his genitals and then Father Cote performing fellatio oral sex on him. Mr. _____ says that the sex acts took place in the livingroom of Father Cote's cottage. Mr. _____ says that Father Cote paid him forty dollars for the yard work. _____ further says that Father Cote performed fellatio on him approximately twenty times over the next five years and that all the acts took place at the cottage or in the Jacuzzi later added at the cottage. _____ says that he was not forced or coerced to engage in the sexual acts described.

SUMMARY OF FATHER RONALD P. COTE'S RESPONSE TO ALLEGATIONS

On May 2, 2002, Lt. Brown and Det. Almstrom interviewed Father Cote and confronted him with _____ allegations. Father Cote acknowledged a sexual relationship with _____. Father Cote said he first met _____ when he picked him up hitchhiking and offered him yard work. Father Cote said that _____ accepts and subsequently performed various tasks for Father Cote such as hauling brush, raking and staining the house. Father Cote indicated that he started building the cottage in Newport in the fall of 1982 and had it completed in the spring of 1983. Father Cote indicated that the sexual relationship between he and Mr. _____ started in 1985 or 1986 and continued over a five-year period. Father Cote stated that during that period he had sexual contact with _____ approximately five or six times. Father Cote stated that he could not recall exactly how the relationship turned sexual but did recall that _____ had told him that he was willing to do more than just yard work for money. Father Cote said the sex acts included his rubbing _____ down and performing fellatio on him. Father Cote said he believed that _____ was eighteen years old or older at the time of their first sexual encounter. Father Cote said that he would pay _____ fifteen or twenty dollars for the sex. Father Cote said _____ never touched him in a sexual way.

LAW AND ANALYSIS

New Hampshire Revised Statutes Annotated (after this RSA) 632-A:3 (Supp. 1981/1982), entitled Felonious Sexual Assault, reads in pertinent part: "A person is guilty of a class B felony . . . if he engages in sexual penetration with a person who is thirteen years or older and under 16 years." Thus, the elements the State must prove, in order to convict a person of the crime of Felonious Sexual Assault are: (1) that the defendant had sexual penetration with another; and (2) that the other person was thirteen, fourteen or fifteen years of age at the time.

The term "sexual penetration" as used in RSA 632-A:3 (Supp. 1981/1982) is defined in RSA 632-A:2 (Supp. 1981/1982) which reads, in pertinent part: "'(s)exual penetration' means sexual intercourse, cunnilingus, fellatio . . . or any intrusion . . . of any part of the actor's body . . . into the genital or anal opening of the victim's body."

The crime of Felonious Sexual Assault, as set forth above, is commonly termed "statutory rape." Felonious Sexual Assault differs from many of the other types of criminal sexual assault in that the consent of the alleged victim to the sexual penetration is not a defense.

The State, by enacting RSA 632-A:3, has fixed the age at which a person may consent to sexual penetration at sixteen years of age. In essence, this provision, prohibits an adult, such as Father Cote, from engaging in sexual penetration with a person who is below the fixed age of consent. This prohibition applies even if the alleged victim willingly participates in or even starts the sexual acts. The rationale behind this statutory scheme are the concern that minors below a certain age are unable to make mature judgments about important matters such as when to engage in sexual penetration and the State's recognition of the vulnerability of children to such harm.

Father Cote and [REDACTED] both acknowledge sexual acts between them (fellatio) which, if committed by Father Cote on [REDACTED] before [REDACTED] sixteenth birthday, would be Felonious Sexual Assault by Father Cote upon [REDACTED]. The issue thus becomes one of determining if any of the incidents of fellatio took place before [REDACTED] sixteenth birthday. Father Cote and [REDACTED] both agree that the sex acts took place at Father Cote's cottage on Skyline Drive in Newport, New Hampshire.

While I have reviewed the entire investigative file, I find the following points particularly persuasive in reaching the conclusion that when Father Cote first performed fellatio on [REDACTED] that [REDACTED] was sixteen years of age or older.

[REDACTED] sixteenth birthday is [REDACTED]

- Father Cote purchases the Skyline Drive property on June 3, 1982. According to the deed there was no building on the property when it was purchased by Father Cote in June of 1982.
- Father Cote was issued a building permit, by the Town of Newport, for a small dwelling on the Skyline Drive property on July 29, 1982. Thus, approximately two months before [REDACTED] sixteenth birthday, construction had not yet started on the cottage at the Cote property.

[REDACTED] in his April 25, 2002 interview with Lt. Brown and Detective Almstrom, said Father Cote asked him why he was not in school on the day of their first meeting/ first instance of fellatio at the Cote cottage. [REDACTED] also said that he was wearing shorts on that day.

[REDACTED] according to records from the Newport High School, left school on March 19, 1982 for placement at the Youth Development Center (after this YDC).

-YDC records, reviewed by Lt. Brown, show that:

- Between March 16, 1982 and August 27, 1982, [REDACTED] was housed at YDC.
- Between August 27, 1982 and September 9, 1982, [REDACTED] was on extended furlough from YDC with his mother.
- Between September 9, 1982 and November 8, 1982, [REDACTED] was placed on ARP (Administrative Release and Parole) with his mother.
- Between November 8, 1982 and April 14, 1983, [REDACTED] was placed with his mother.
- Between April 14, 1983 and [REDACTED] [REDACTED] was returned to YDC and housed at Kings Cottage until his release on his 17th birthday.

[REDACTED] in the May 1, 2002 interview with Lt. Brown and Det. Almstrom, acknowledged that:

- he met Father Cote "about a year" after he was furloughed from YDC.
- that the cottage had been established and furnished for a period of time when he first went there with Father Cote.
- the lawn was well established around the cottage when he first went there with Father Cote.
- that it was summer when he first met Father Cote.

As noted above, the investigation clearly shows that the State cannot prove-beyond a reasonable doubt- that any of the acts of fellatio took place before [REDACTED] sixteenth birthday on [REDACTED]. The cottage where Father Cote performed fellatio on [REDACTED] was not under construction as of July 29, 1982. [REDACTED] at the time of the first act of fellatio, describes the cottage as well established, furnished and with an established lawn. In addition, [REDACTED] says that the first incidence of fellatio took place "about a year" after his furlough from YDC. [REDACTED] was furloughed from YDC on September 9, 1982.

I have, in examining this matter, also determined that there is not probable cause to believe that Father Cote has committed the crime of Felonious Sexual Assault upon [REDACTED]. The fair import of the evidence in this case is that the acts of fellatio between Father Cote and [REDACTED] took place, at the earliest, in the summer of 1983 and that the acts of fellatio were consensual. [REDACTED] does not allege, nor do the facts suggest, that the Father

Cote, when performing fellatio upon [REDACTED] did so by use of force, the threat of force, coercion, the abuse of the priest/parishioner relationship, the abuse of a position of authority, or under any other circumstance prohibited by the criminal laws of New Hampshire.


During the course of this investigation [REDACTED] has alleged that Father Cote provided him with alcohol and controlled drugs. I will not address the merits of this allegation because it is clear, irrespective of the merits of the allegation, that the alleged crime is not capable of prosecution because it is outside the applicable statute of limitations.

During the course of the investigation, [REDACTED] has acknowledged the unlawful use of controlled drugs, alcohol and his involvement in a burglary at the residence of Father Cote. No action will be taken with respect to these matters as all are outside the applicable statute of limitations.

During the course of this investigation, Father Cote has admitted to acts of prostitution with [REDACTED]. This admission, even if true, cannot be the basis for a criminal prosecution of either Father Cote or [REDACTED] these acts fall outside the applicable statute of limitations.



Received call from Joyce VEON, Director of Medical Records at NH State Prison. Inquired whether there was any entry in the [REDACTED] that would show that he had reported abuse by a Priest while at the prison.

VEON call and advised she had reviewed the file and only finds reference to [REDACTED] being abused by his father from the ages of 5 to 14 years. The father passed away at that time. Dr. DeNUNE was the Psychologist at the time and is currently working in MASS.

Spoke with Capt. BALLOU of the Newport NH PD. [REDACTED] had mentioned that COTE had an accident in Newport. Inquired of BALLOU if he could confirm the accident. BALLOU advised the department had gone to computer in 1993. The old paper files are supposed to be in the basement. BALLOU advised that he has been unable to locate the card file that was in existence at that time and also the police department has moved from one building to another. During the move all of the records for 1985 have been misplaced. BALLOU is unable to confirm there was an accident by COTE in the 80s.

Det. Lt. James BROWN came on the line. He was able to advise that 10 or 12 years prior there was a burglary at the COTE residence. The only items stolen were alcohol and he questioned whether it might have been [REDACTED] that was responsible because of his prior burglary history and alcohol use.

23 APR 02 received call from Offender Records. Requested they review the PSI to determine if [REDACTED] had ever mentioned anything regarding being abused by a priest. All PSIs were reviewed and there is nothing that refers to a report of being sexually abused by a priest.



RE: Father Roland P. Cote

On January 2nd, 1990, I received a phone call from a [REDACTED] from Colebrook. She had been referred to me by Father Marc Montminy. She had some serious concerns about Father Roland Cote. She claimed that she had become friendly with a [REDACTED] a young man from Florida whom Father Cote had brought to Colebrook to assist him in getting rid of drug problems. He had been staying with Father Cote in the rectory. She said Father Cote became very disturbed at the friendship which developed between them, to the point where he did not let them meet one another or communicate with one another in any way. When I asked her how she explained his concerns, she said she felt that he was jealous of [REDACTED]. She continued that ultimately [REDACTED] had moved out of the rectory, and was now living in Berlin. Father Cote, in anger at all that had happened, called her pet grooming service and left two messages on her answering machine. One of these messages was terribly vulgar. She claims to have a copy of it.

In the course of her conversation with me, she indicated that several people told her Father Cote has a serious drinking problem, and he also is a homosexual. She is concerned at his irrational behavior, allegedly because she has two children in the parish school at West Stewartstown.

On February 26th, after he returned from a winter vacation, I met with Father Cote. The meeting was affable and productive. Father Cote admits to the vulgar message. He claims it was stimulated by the scandal of the relationship between [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] and at his frustration at being manipulated by both of them. He claims he has written a letter of apology to [REDACTED] (admits to having received this letter). I indicated to Father Cote that my reason for talking with him was the two points [REDACTED] raised in her complaint. The first of these is that he had a serious drinking problem. I indicated my concern at this statement, given a previous history of concerns in this regard by his own family. Father Cote indicated to me there is no doubt that on some occasions in the past he has drunk to excess. He indicated, however, that he does not

drink regularly, and that when his family expressed concern several years ago he went to an alcoholic counselor in the north country whose series of tests indicated he did not have a problem with drinking. Father Cote said he recognizes that drinking to excess even on occasion could be a sign of a more serious problem, but he does not believe this is inevitable and he is not psychologically disposed to seeking any further counseling at this time. I told him the Diocese valued his ministry, and we did not want him denying a problem and seeking help for it if such help was warranted. I urged him to let the Diocese assist him if that became necessary. I urged him, as well, to be honest with himself so that he would not endanger his health or his ministry.

In regard to the alleged problem of homosexuality, Father Cote denied having any such problem at all. I once again urged him not to refuse to seek help if help was warranted in this area, since it would only harm him at some point. Father Cote seemed genuinely pleased at the concern of the Diocese for him, but he does not feel that he needs any assistance at this time.

My evaluation is as follows. Having spoken with Father Robert Gorski, who is very close to Father Cote and with whom Father Cote does not know I discussed these issues, it would appear to me that Father Cote's drinking is probably not a major problem at this time, although his psychological fragility could easily lead to an abuse of alcohol on a regular basis. He needs to be monitored in this regard, and should future concerns regarding his drinking surface we would need to require professional testing at that time.

??
Based on previous incidents, we know that Father Cote has had some problems with homosexuality. While he does not admit to this problem, and while there was no homosexual involvement with the young man in this instance by the young man's own admission, it would appear that there is potential for a difficulty here. Father Gorski indicates he feels Father Cote has a much greater control over this area of his life now, but it was true in the past. My conclusion would be that once again, in the event of any any future documented evidence of this problem, he would need to be confronted and treated clinically. At present I feel it is sufficient that Father Cote knows of our concern in both areas, and of our desire to help him. I make this conclusion because neither of the charges can be clearly documented at this point. Should such documentation be available in the future, it will be necessary for us to insist that he receive the appropriate therapy.

MEMORANDUM

DATE: 5 February 1986

RE: Fr. Roland Cote

I received a telephone call this morning from Mr. William Lovett who works at Easter Seal ([redacted]) (home tel. # [redacted]). He told me that Fr. Roland Cote is having difficulty at Saint Albert Parish in West Stewartstown in relation to his alcoholism. He is drinking again. His family wants to do something about it. The family will be meeting with Bill Lovett this Friday.

Forty-five minutes after I spoke with Bill Lovett, Jim Hawkes, Fr. Cote's brother-in-law called. He wanted to fill me in on the situation as the family sees it.

There has been no blatant problems in West Stewartstown in relation to Roland's drinking. The Sisters have noticed it and so has Wendell Cross, a parishioner. The drinking started approximately one year ago and has progressed. On one occasion Roland called his mother and started to cry, expressing that he was depressed. Jim assured me that West Stewartstown has been very good for Roland.

The family are suggesting that Roland go to Guest House. Fr. Dan Deveau has volunteered to take over Roland's parish duties when Roland will have to go away. Fr. Deveau has also noticed Roland's drinking.

This afternoon Fr. Dan Deveau came in to speak to me about the situation. He reiterated much of what Jim Hawkes told me. When the family goes through the intervention with Roland on Friday evening, Dan will also be there. Dan is also willing to cover in West Stewartstown on week ends.

DATE: 7 February 1986

After 9 telephone calls, I was finally able to find coverage for Dan in Henniker this week end. Marc Gagne will take his place since John McQuaid and Connie Goggin can cover St. Elizabeth Seton.

I called Jim Hawkes to bring him up to date on what has transpired since we last spoke. Jim told me that Roland's two sisters will be picking up Roland at the airport this evening and bringing him to Manchester where the intervention will take place. I mentioned to him that all of them have our support. I asked him to keep in touch with us.



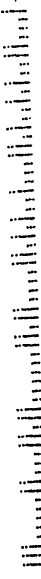



2. During his investigation on behalf of his clients, including but not limited to a deposition taken of Rev. Robert E. Gorski in the pending case of Murray v. Robichaud, Belknap County Superior Court (02-C-085), Petitioner has developed information leading him to understand that the Attorney General's Office and the Sullivan County Attorney's Office, including any other state or local police department or law enforcement agency, conducted an investigation into allegations of sexual abuse against Rev. Roland P. Cote, recently reassigned from Nashua, NH to St. Patrick's parish in Jaffrey, NH.

3. Petitioner believes the information contained in this investigative file(s) is relevant to his ongoing work on behalf of his clients, including particularly the plaintiff in the Murray case, even though under RSA 91-A, no showing of relevance or need is required.

4. The defendants, and these records, fall within the purview of the Right-to-Know law. RSA 91-A:1-a, IV.

5. These records are public records of agencies covered by the statute. RSA 91-A:4, I.

6. The only information likely contained in defendants' files which may arguably be exempted from production would be the identity of the alleged victim. The Petitioner would agree, at this time, that the identity of the alleged victim may be redacted from the materials sought.

7. "To advance the purposes of the Right-to-Know Law, [the court] construe[s] provisions favoring disclosure broadly and exemptions narrowly." *Union Leader Corp. v. City of Nashua*, 141 NH 473, 475 (1996).

8. Any confusion regarding whether the contents of police investigative files are

subject to the Right-to-Know law was put to rest by the Supreme Court over 20 years ago in *Lodge v. Knowlton*, 118 NH 574 (1978).

9. In *Lodge*, the Court adopted the federal six-prong test contained in the Freedom of Information Act, 5 U.S.C. § 552(b)(7) (Supp. 1975).

10. To find law enforcement investigatory records exempt from production, the defendant must prove one of the following "six statutory adverse results-" that production would:

- A) interfere with enforcement proceedings;
- B) deprive a person of a right to a fair trial or an impartial adjudication;
- C) constitute an unwarranted invasion of privacy;
- D) disclose the identity of a confidential source, etc.;
- E) disclose investigative techniques and procedures; or
- F) endanger the life or physical safety of law enforcement personnel.

11. None of these facts exist in this case.

12. It is the understanding of Petitioner, which was further confirmed by the sworn deposition testimony of Rev. Robert E. Gorski mentioned above, that the investigation into these specific allegations by the defendants has been concluded.

13. Accordingly, under the law of New Hampshire, the file of the defendants, must be produced pursuant to the Right-to-Know law.

14. A letter formally requesting production of the files was faxed to the defendants (or their representatives) by Petitioner on August 30, 2002. See letter attached to Petition.

15. Petitioner has received no response.

16. Petitioner has forwarded a copy of this Petition, by fax this day, to both defendants.

17. Petitioner would request the scheduling of an expedited hearing within two (2) weeks since the matter is straight forward, and since the materials sought are important to the continuing ongoing investigation by Petitioner of legal matters for his clients. RSA 91-A:7. There is no need to delay the hearing until after a return date, etc.

WHEREFORE, the Petitioner requests the following relief:

- A. That this Court order the defendants to produce their entire investigative files, omitting nothing, with regard to allegations of sexual abuse made against Rev. Roland P. Cote earlier this year;
- B. That an expedited hearing on this matter be scheduled within the next 2 weeks as the Court's calendar permits; and
- C. For other such relief as may be just.

JB This is Lt. Brown at the Newport Police Department. I'm at State Police Headquarters with Trooper Detective Jason Armstrong and also here with [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] The date is April 25, 2002. The time is about 1:55 p.m. [REDACTED] you know that you're being audio recorded right now, is that right?

[REDACTED] Yes.

JB Okay. And we had asked to meet with you here today 'cause we wanted to discuss with you some of the information that we've received about something that's happened to you in the past. Um, first let me ask you, we wanna talk a little bit about the chronology of events. About when certain things happened. Let's go back to um, the first time that you met this person. Tell us who, who we're talking about and when ah, how long ago, you think, we're talking or an event or something like that that may have been in your life if you remember something um, or just tell us about this person in general when you first met him, how you came about to meet this person and who we're talking about.

[REDACTED] Okay. Um, we're talking about Father Roland Cote, as I got to know him by. Um, first time I met him, I was hitchhiking from Claremont, New Hampshire, into Newport 'cause I was seein' a girl by the name of [REDACTED] who lived over there on [REDACTED] with her stepmother, [REDACTED] and um, I was hitchhiking back. He picked me up hitchhiking, Father Cote did and asked me if I was interested in doing some work, yard work, and I says yeah. And he took to a cottage up off from Unity Road and I know it's Skyline Drive and I did some work out in his yard. I hauled some brush out of the woods. He asked me if I wanted something to drink. I'm like yeah. I believe I was fifteen or sixteen, I'm not exactly sure as to my age. A lot's transpired in my life since then. Um, asked me if I wanted somethin' to drink. I said sure. He came out and gave me a rum and coke and had a drink himself and we sat on a picnic table and then he asked if I wanted to go inside and cool off a little bit, that it was cooler inside. I went inside. He started rubbin' my leg. Worked his way up my leg to my penis, my dick. Huh, sorry about, I might use some bad language or somethin'—

JB That's all right. Feel free to talk openly with us.

██████████ And um, he, he started suckin' my dink. I asked him if it was all right, you know, 'cause it's a bad thing for a priest to do that. He had a collar on and stuff. And we had a conversation that it, it wasn't a sin in God's eyes to do that. It wasn't wrong for him to do that. And I had, boy or boy or boy, I had, I grew up all my life huh, huh, on ██████████ there and, Catholic Church. I didn't go to church the way I should've after my father passed away but, as a child I went and, there were dou-, I, I was all mixed up because I wasn't huh, I got one, one of the men from the cloth that I go in to confess to tellin' me that it's all right to do what he was doin', you know? And so he did it and paid me 40 dollars. He said it was for the yard work.

JB And where did this take place?

██████████ Where? In a cottage on Skyline Drive.

JB Where at the cottage?

██████████ At that time the cottage only was like, two rooms, the living room part.

JB Okay. And that was the first time that you had met him?

██████████ Yes.

JB Did you meet him after that?

██████████ Yes.

JB Can you tell us about that?

██████████ Whenever he was at the cottage he would get in touch with me, call me at, I was livin' on ██████████, corner of ██████████ a big white place. It's since been torn down. And he was callin', ask me if I wanna do some work and I, yeah. Go up and do a little bit of work and things would just, it would all happen out of, you know, the same way almost but I mean, there was times when he, he smoked pot with me. A time when he gave me that rush stuff in a bottle. I had just learned that, I, I never had that. I've had lots and lots and lots of drugs in my life, you know, tried 'em but not, not that. Rush, yeah, I, I didn't like it but you're suppose to snort it when you're about ready to have an orgasm. And he would, he would never, he would never want me, ask me, influence me in any way to touch him, though. But he would have an orgasm by blowin' me. And that's ah, that's a sickness. That's a, I didn't know it was a sickness. I, I, I didn't know what he was doin', you know, but ha, he would get off by doin' that to me.

JB So he was touching himself at the same time as he was touching you?

██████████ No, he wasn't touching himself.

JB No?

██████████ Because he had, no, he, he would have, like, it'd be by my boobies, my tits.

JB Yeah.

██████████ And stuff like that because, his hands weren't free to touch himself. He just got off.

JB Yeah.

[REDACTED] I don't know.

JB So how many times do you think this happened?

[REDACTED] Twenty.

JB Over how long a period of time?

[REDACTED] 5 years, 4 or 5 years. Until I went down for my first state prison (unintelligible).

JB So the last time it happened was how soon before you went to state prison do you think?

[REDACTED] Probably a week or two.

JB So a week or two before you went to state prison was the last time it happened.

[REDACTED] Before I got arrested.

JB And it started probably 4 to 5 years before that time.

[REDACTED] Approximately, yeah.

JB Had other people seen Father Cote with you during that time frame? During those 4 to 5 years?

[REDACTED] Yes.

JB Had other people seen him with you?

[REDACTED] Yes. Yes. My brothers, my mother were well aware I was doin' work for the guy. They didn't know what was goin' on. And I'd come home and give my mom some of my money 'cause my, like I said, my dad had just passed away. He, he had a business and when his business went, my mother's whole way of livin' had, was altered, you know.

JB You say your dad passed away and that you had met Father Cote. Do you know how long a period of time that was? From the time that your dad passed away until the first time that you had this—

[REDACTED] A year or two.

JB So a year or two. So your mother was well aware that you were doing work with him. Um, had other people seen you two together?

[REDACTED] Yeah, the other priests.

JB The other priests.

[REDACTED] There, there's two other priests that kiss each other that live there. Openly faggot mother fuckers. Excuse me but, they would do it right in front of me.

JB Do you know what their names were at all?

[REDACTED] No.

JB No.

- He introduced them but that was, this was a long time ago. They were younger guys.
- JB Did you see them do anything else besides kissing? I mean any, any sexual acts in front of you or anything like that?
- No but I, I, throughout the years, they had a bedroom added on for those two.
- JB Okay.
- And then they had to sell it so Larry um, he bought a spa to put me in or to offer a Jacuzzi thing.
- JB Umm hmm. Did they ever see you and, and ah, Father Cote having sex or anything like that?
- Not sex. They saw us together but—
- JB Together, okay.
- Never.
- JB And you never saw those other two priests having sex or anything like that.
- No.
- JB Just kissing.
- Um hmm.
- JB Did (unintelligible)
- Hold, holding each other.
- JB Did ah, did Father Cote ever give you any gifts, any letters, any, anything like that? Did he ever give you any, any gifts other than the money that—
- He wrote to me and sent me money when I was in prison. Yes. He did do that. The prison would have records of that.
- JB Do you happen to have, still have that letter?
- No. That was my first sentence. I got outta that '89. Yeah.
- JB What was that letter about when he sent you that letter?
- It was, may God be with you. He used, this dude used to pray with me. You know? I was, I was hurtin'. I was mixed up because my dad and, and I was in confusion because I didn't know where to go as far as my life. I, I know I had had a restraining order put on me from the high school, you know, that they didn't want me on their property. And ah, I was ah, doomed or something. I wasn't doomed but I just didn't realize I had choices.
- JB Umm.
- That I could a reached out to people but I just didn't.
- JB So the whole time and, the last time that he saw you you said was, was when you went, that was the last time you saw him was when you went to state prison?

[REDACTED] Before I went.

JB Yeah. And so, he sent you a letter while you were in prison.

[REDACTED] Um hmm.

JB Um, so as of the last time that you've talked to him, he's still seemed like he was close to you or that he cared about you, is that right?

[REDACTED] Somewhat. The last time I talked to him on the phone was about 2 years ago.

JB Oh really.

[REDACTED] I was livin' in Manchester and I had gotten engaged—

JB Umm hmm.

[REDACTED] -- to my fiancée, still to this day. I ain't gotten married yet, thank God.

JB (Chuckle)

[REDACTED] Well I was married once before too so, (unintelligible) girl. And um, but I called him and asked, me and my counselor were tryin' to figure it out 'cause I've been, I been, I started, I've seen a counselor at the same time in regards to this issue at the Bedford Counseling Center.

JB Umm hmm.

[REDACTED] And, but I never told him that it was a priest. I disguised it as bein' someone else but I told, we talked about it and then he wanted to increase my time seein' him to even more times a week. Three times a week he wanted to see me and then I ended up gettin', I had my parole violated for bein' with a convicted felon.

JB So, but you talked to him on the phone.

[REDACTED] Yes. I called him and asked him if he could refer me to a marriage counselor. We, I wasn't sure if I was rubbin' it in sayin' ha, ha, I'm not a faggot like you.

JB Yeah.

[REDACTED] Still haven't, we haven't worked that out.

JB How did he respond to you when he first heard from you?

[REDACTED] How you doin'. It's been a long time. And then I explained to what, what my conversation was about, you know, why I was callin' and he gave me some names of someone ah, the street behind, over to Manchester on the west side but I never went to him. Never went. Because we got violated like a week later. Me and my fiancée. To this day violator put us back for a year, let us out, let us live together. That's how it went. Because we didn't have permission. Now I ask permission for every little thing I gotta do.

JB What, what's your date of birth [REDACTED]

JB And your address now is what?

[REDACTED]
JB And do you have a phone there?

[REDACTED] Yeah. [REDACTED]

JB That's your cell phone?

[REDACTED] No. No, it's a [REDACTED]

JB Oh, okay.

[REDACTED] It's just, it's Concord's um, AT&T Broadband digital system.

JB All right.

[REDACTED] I have a phone, cable, all that stuff hitched up into one payment. And that way we gotta pay that bill.

JB At that time when this was first starting, when this was first happening, did you talk to other people about it?

[REDACTED] No. No.

JB Have you talked to anybody other than recently to the Attorney General's Office and to your attorney. Have you talked to other people?

[REDACTED] No. But there's things, my brother told me about somebody else that Father Cote tried somethin' with. I can't remember whether it was [REDACTED] or [REDACTED] [REDACTED] I can't remember which one of those two it was. But they went back to, within a day or two after and kicked in his door and stole stuff from the guy. I can't remember who, I can't just, you know, I can't remember who they were because this was years ago.

JB Umm hmm.

[REDACTED] I could ask [REDACTED] and confront [REDACTED] with it but then [REDACTED] gonna start askin' me questions and they don't know, I, I --

JB Yeah.

[REDACTED] -- my mother don't know this. My brothers don't know this. And I don't know how idiotic shit head [REDACTED] gonna react. I mean, what's he gonna, is he gonna get a bottle of Jim Beam, get it in him and then go hunt this dude down.

JB Yeah.

[REDACTED] You know.

JB We don't, we don't wanna do that.

[REDACTED] [REDACTED] share an apartment. So --

JB Where are they at?

[REDACTED] They [REDACTED] work for the same company and [REDACTED] makin' guns. (Laughter).

JB Well I, I guess one question that, that comes up is, is why come forward now?

Part of gettin' me better, I gotta clean out my closet, that's what they tell, my counselors, my sponsors have told me, you have to clean your closets out, which is all the dirty stuff and the dirty stuff includes this, it includes my dad kickin' the shit out of me and it includes my dad beatin' me up ah, [REDACTED] unnin' to the police. [REDACTED] endin' me back home and then gettin' another beatin' because [REDACTED] ent me back home and the resentments that I've held over the years for that episode because of that incident, I held, I did hold resentments, in my mind I did, towards the whole police as a whole, not just [REDACTED] but police as a whole, you know. And it's, it's stuff like that that I have to clean out. Otherwise, it's gonna come back, kick me in the butt and I, who, who knows where I'm gonna be at that time and if I'm gonna pick up again or if I'm gonna just go beserk like Drega did up there in North, you know. I'm productive today. I am. I'm a very, I'm a productive person, you know. I work hard for my money. I, everything I have, I own. You know.

JB But why start with an attorney.

[REDACTED] I didn't start with an attorney. I started with Bedford Counseling Center.

JB Okay.

[REDACTED] Yup.

JB Did they, and your, your ah, understanding with your attorney today is what? What has your attorney told you or what kind of an agreement do you have with, with the attorney?

[REDACTED] Civil charges. Criminal charges and ah, a civil suit or somethin' like that. I've put no price or nothin'. He says if we end up with money out of it he gets one third per cent. Other than that, even we, I mean I, I don't know what I signed yesterday. I signed a bunch of papers.

JB Okay.

[REDACTED] And they're gonna be put on hold or somethin' for a couple months or somethin'. So Marc Hathaway can do what he's gotta do without alertin' this guy. I don't know. That's how they explained it to me. I'm on a different slide today, you know.

JB Umm hmm.

[REDACTED] And I'm not familiar with this side. I'm familiar with the opposite side, the criminal side, yeah, you know. But not the legalities --

JB Well Marc, Marc Hathaway can ah, get that information or details from your attorney.

[REDACTED] Right.

JB Um.

[REDACTED] There's never been no price or nothin'. I want him off the street. And my attorney guaranteed me that yes, he will be takin' off the street from hurtin' other people, you know. And they kept movin' the guy around. Throughout these years the guy was

moved like three different times. I remember him bein' at three different areas throughout New Hampshire, Vermont and Massachusetts, you know. And now he's sittin' there, king stylin' in the middle of Nashua New Hampshire which is one of the biggest cities in the state and who knows how many children he's hurt already and could end up like I ended up. (Laughter). That's devastatin' to think about if you look at my track record. My past, yeah. It's, it's a devastatin' thing. And if I can stop that from happenin' to another child, I would, I would love to. I'll tell, I told the Attorney General, I'll tell everybody yeah, I think about puttin' a slug in the guy's head. Of course, the thought comes to my mind but that's wrong. I could never do that, you know. I could never do that. He has a disease. See, livin' with pedophiles in state prison, 'cause they don't have a PC no more.

JB Umm hmm.

You live with 'em. You inter react with 'em. And livin' with them, I realize, it is, it is a disease, it's a disease. Just like my substance abuse problem was a disease. Alcoholism is a disease. Pedophilia is what they call, I worked with two of 'em that I was in prison with right now at the 99, you know. And that, I've gotta keep my personal vendettas 'cause I, I hate 'em for what they done but not who they are, you know. They, they did bad things. They took somethin' from people. It was like, for me, it caused me mass confusion because I just didn't know, I used to go and talk to Father Savage when I was real young, real, real young at, at St. Mary's and it was, I don't know, years and years ago and I, I could confess to him and tell him things and clarify my, purify myself. After my nana died we went, like a lot. Sunday school, we were catechism and all that stuff, us boys did. And I felt relieved but I, I, I couldn't, I haven't been near a catholic church since. I won't, since this stuff started.

JB You mentioned something about an accident. Can you tell us about that?

Yeah. One, one, one of the times we were, I got up and do, done work for him. After I, I never, I never finished the job. The job never got finished to this day that I know of. Clearing out those, 'cause that's what he had me doin' was clearin' out his woods and he had miles and miles of woods if you ask me. I don't know exactly how many acres he has but there was a lot of woods there. I mean, goin' in there, pullin' brush out, bringin' it out, stickin' it in a pile. And I, okay, I did. He gave me money for it and after a while I, I grew a dependency upon smoking marijuana but one day he introduced, ah, when we were sittin' around, asked me if I wanted to smoke a joint. Sure. And I smoked a joint of marijuana with him. 'Bout an hour after that, I don't know exactly how long, he brought me home. He dropped me off and I found out, the next time I went and saw him, which was like a week or two later, I had found out he'd crashed his car on his way back home that day, that evening. It was later on in the evening. He'd gone off the road and drove into a ho-, a tree, a white birch 'cause he told me he had to buy white, excuse me, replace a white birch or somethin', on someone's lawn 'cause he was so stoned.

JB You don't know, do you know where that was?

█ On Unity Road. It was right off 'cause he pointed it to me like the next time, when we had met before he'd say, see that's where I went off the road.

JB When you first turn from Unity Road to Skyline Drive?

█ No. No. It was (unintelligible) by stones.

JB (Unintelligible) Okay.

█ On the right hand side if you're goin' into Newport, it's on the right hand side.

JB Passed stones?

█ Yup.

JB Did he have to get the vehicle towed or anything like that, do you remember?

█ The police came and he had to have the insurance people and stuff like that.

JB Do you remember if anybody towed the vehicle? If he had it down on anybody's, any, any wrecker place or anything like that?

█ No, I don't remember that.

JB Did he total it? I mean what was the damage to it?

█ Smashed up the front, yeah.

JB But the police came.

█ Yes.

JB And you have any idea what year we're talking about here?

█ No.

JB What was it for a vehicle? What did he have for a vehicle? Or was it a pick-up truck or car?

█ No, no. He had, he had a car, a white car I think at that time.

JB Okay.

█ White or tan. He, he had a couple different cars. He's never had a truck.

JB Four door, two door, small, big?

█ Medium, medium compact.

JB So when this accident happened, how far along into your relationship, if I can call it that, with him were you?

█ It, you can't call it a relationship 'cause it wasn't no relationship.

JB Umm hmm.

█ A relationship is somethin' I have with my fiancée.

JB Right.

█ You know. This is, this was no relationship.

JB Well how, how far along into this was this accident? You said that --

█ About a year, year and a half.

JB Oh, okay.

█ Maybe approximately.

JB And um, you talked before about this burglary that took place where somebody went in and --

█ Umm hmm.

JB -- and ah, did these things. How far into it was that?

█ Towards the end.

JB That was towards the end.

█ Like six, eight months before it ended.

JB So that was --

█ I think the burglary happened a couple of times. Because one of the times, am I immune from prosecution on this? (Laughter) I shared in the wealth of one of the burglaries on Father's Day.

JB Umm hmm.

█ I remember it was a Father's Day and we were sittin' at █ place in Bedford New Hampshire. She had that little place where she was sellin' the herb out of.

JB And what was --

█ Got cases of booze out of that. At least (unintelligible)

JB That's a name from the past, huh?

█ Yup. It got twisted.

JB Um, so there was a couple burglaries then that, that you at least know of from that, that house and one of 'em was a couple of months before the end and the other one was around that same time or?

█ No. Probably six, eight months before that. I think only one of 'em he reported.

JB Umm hmm.

█ Because he asked me, he asked me about the first one and I, I had no knowledge of that, I don't think.

JB Is that the one you think █ went into? Or did they go into (unintelligible)

█ They didn't go into it. They --

JB Or they busted it up or somethin'.

█ Yeah. I was told that he tried somethin' with one of those, it was one of those two guys.

JB Okay.

█ That he tried somethin' with, touchin' 'em right in their friggin' leg.

JB Right. Umm hmm.

█ And they got out of the car and said fuck you da, da, da. And then gathered up some people, ballsy people or whatever you wanna call it.

JB Umm hmm.

█ And just went in and took what they wanted and left.

JB And that one was, how, how close to the end? About a year or so?

█ Yeah. I think one of my █ as a player in one of those B&Es you know. I'm just not sure.

JB Umm hmm. You're just kinda using that as, as trying to figure out time frames.

█ Umm hmm. The time frames, they're hard for me to figure it out.

JB Yeah.

█ And as, it's hard.

JB The reason why we're tryin' to figure out the time frames is, you know, um, a responsibility to look at certain dates and see if the, if the statute of limitations is still there. Just like, just like a burglary where we can only go back a certain amount of years, you know.

█ Right.

JB Somebody had missed some burglary that had happened ten years ago, you know, we might not be able to do anything. But, and, and so, each crime has their own statute of limitations. The only crime that doesn't have a statute of limitations is murder. Um, and ah, sexual assault is a little bit different than the regular types of crimes. That has a little bit different ah, statute of limitations so it's important for us to try to figure out as closely as we can to time frames here because it's different after you turn a certain age.

█ Well, I've noticed like in the past month as days go on and I talk to █, my attorney, about it or I, I sit at home and I think about it or even at work. Things, things reoccur in my mind. It's just, I don't, you guys only know the tip of the iceberg.

JB Umm hmm.

█ Of the substances like, I married the █ girl. I met the █ girl (unintelligible). She was (unintelligible) AC/DC concert and she was sellin' LSD. I fell in love with her acid. And I was buyin' a thousand hits at a time in New Haven Connecticut you

know and, I don't know how many, hundreds of, I mean, I need twenty hits of acid at a time and just, and just, I lost it. I can't get it back. They told me that. My counselors have told me brain cells don't come back, you know. But you can get strength in what you have, you know.

JB Had you been using marijuana before you, you met this priest?

█ No. I had been drinkin' alcohol. No, I'd been drinkin' alcohol since I think I was 6 years old.

JB Hmm.

█ I'd take drinks off my, when I lived on █. █ to live years and years ago.

JB So the first time you had marijuana was, was with him?

█ I believe so. I'm not exactly sure but it made it feel better, believe it or not. It made, 'cause I could relax. (Unintelligible) and that what happens to this day. (Unintelligible) been counseling. I mean I'm not a fuckin' nut. I'm not a nut. And I don't need to see where they send all these patients from the state nut house you know but, because, people, I have nightmares. I have dreams, yeah. Not, not about this, yes, but about other things that I've done in my life, you know, that keep comin' back to haunt me. Some day, when I know ten years has transpired through I ever done, I will come up and say listen to this stuff and I will tell you everything I ever did just to clear it off the records or whatever it may be done but I'm not, I don't belong in state prison no more. You guys got what you wanted, you know. You, you wanted me rehabilitated and they succeeded. It took twelve, fourteen years and what, YDC, county jails, two stints in state prison but I got it, you know. I'm, you know, bull headed or somethin' but it finally kicked in, you know.

JB Well, we are glad to hear that. That, that you're doin' good.

█ And even if my (unintelligible) did not have a restraining order against me or whatever, you know, sayin' that I can't go to Newport.

JB Yeah.

█ I have nothin' there. I have bad memories. What, you know, what, what am I gonna go hug all those potheads and drug addicts up there? 'Cause I, I ask questions. I talk to my brother █ on the phone. I haven't seen him, but I talk to him on the phone and the same people are still doin' the same fuckin' shit that they were doin' --

JB Years ago.

█ -- Yeah. Back then and, I don't know, they can't look and see where drugs and behaviors like that get people, by lookin' at █ or the many of other people who have come out of Newport and got put in prison, you know, 'cause there are a few.

JB They have to come to their own reality, huh, and their own --

█ Hit bottom. You gotta hit bottom.

JB Yeah.

Be sick and tired of bein' sick and tired.

JB Umm hmm.

Wonderin' if their gonna catch me on this one, you know. And that wonder always carries along with you for years.

JB Umm hmm.

'Cause you know it can always come back up. Somebody could say the wrong thing to the wrong person. Or I could get drunk, I was run down for that. (Unintelligible) when I'm drunk, you know, and say the wrong thing and boom, you know. I never, I never hurt people to the extent of physical, like killin' people or sexually abusing people. I've never done that, no. I couldn't do that. I couldn't (unintelligible) doin' that.

JB Did this type of thing ever happen to anybody else?

On me?

JB Yeah.

No, no.

JB So who, who was the first person that you told?

And that was your --

Bedford Counseling.

-- Bedford Counseling.

And when I got violated and put back into prison, I wanted to pick up the counseling where I had left off and I told [redacted] about it.

JB [redacted]

JB And that's Bedford Counseling?

Yes.

JB Is that what you said?

Yeah. Affiliated with Manchester Mental Health.

JB And the next person you just said?

JB And he's?

The [redacted], psychotherapist.

JB And when were these two, when did you tell these two people?

[REDACTED] was about two years ago.

JB Umm hmm.

[REDACTED] And [REDACTED] was after [REDACTED] so that was about a year and a half ago. 'Cause I, I, went they put me back in it stopped my counseling and through the meetings that I had had with [REDACTED], made me very emotional because I had this macho image all my life, you know. [REDACTED] gotta be this and this and this. The drug dealer or whatever, you know what I mean. The party (unintelligible). I ain't suppose to cry. I ain't suppose to have feelin's. I ain't suppose to feel my feelins. But you know, he made me cry a lot. He brought a lot of shit out of me but he did it in a, in a gentle fashion sort of say. He, he wasn't makin' fun of me and that's what I always scared to love was a, no one's gonna believe me because a priest is higher than a priest. Okay? Especially sittin' in the town of Newport New Hampshire where you got Judge John Fairbanks puttin' my ass in prison or in jail for doin' wrong when he's doin' wrong himself. You know? (Unintelligible) think of that on the criminal mind, you know? Who, who is this guy? It's like the bible, judge not and thou shall not be judged. This guy's judgin' me but look, take a look in the mirror brother. You know?

JB And, but was it just [REDACTED] that you (unintelligible)

[REDACTED] And I never told them it was a priest.

JB Neither one of them?

[REDACTED] No.

JB Okay.

[REDACTED] I told 'em an, an uncle. But none of my uncles would ever, ever think of touchin' me because a priest is high up there, you know what I mean? People gotta laugh, back then, people would laugh in your face. They honestly would. They would laugh at you if you made an allegation of somethin' like that. Um, I was abused by a priest.

JB: This is Lt. Brown of the Newport Police Department. I'm with Detective Trooper Jason Armstrong of the New Hampshire State Police and [REDACTED]. Today is May 1, 2002. It's approximately 11:45 in the morning. Um, [REDACTED] you (inaudible) audio recorded again?

[REDACTED] Yes.

JB: Okay. [REDACTED] we're here to follow-up some questions about our previous interview that we had. Um, we had a couple of additional questions. Trooper Armstrong and I listened to the audio tape that we did the other day and we had a couple of follow-up things that we wanted to ask you about. Is that all right?

[REDACTED] Yes.

JB: One of the things that we are looking at is, is um, the timeline and trying to understand the timeline as best we can. I know we discussed that and you told us ah in your best recollection the events as they took place. Um, we wanted to talk to you a little bit about some things um and ask you some questions about, lets talk about the house again or [REDACTED] Um, you said that you were removing brush from the backyard. Is that right? From the wooded area?

[REDACTED] If you pull into the driveway it, I remember this whole thing in detail. You've got like a little lawn here and then it goes into the woods more.

JB: Okay.

[REDACTED] That's where he had me do the picking of the brush out in like because there's white birches, a lot of white birches.

JB: So that lawn is his lawn and then you go off of his lawn up into the woods.

[REDACTED] Which I believe is his property.

JB: Yeah. Um, and so we had, so at that point he's got his lawn there and on the lawn he has the ah the bench. Is that right, the picnic table?

[REDACTED] Picnic table at the time yeah.

JB: Around the house ah was there like gravel. I mean was it just newly construction. I mean some gravel.

█ It's stone.

JB: Okay. Was there a lawn around the house? A pretty good established lawn? It didn't look like the house was

█ It's just sitting out.

JB: Okay. But did it look like the house had just been built, you know like under, you know like under construction, the grounds around it like.

█ No.

JB: So it had been established for a period of time.

█ Yeah.

JB: The lawn was pretty well established?

█ Yes.

JB: Okay. Um, did you ever work on ah anything else other than the brush? I know you said, what else did you do?

█ I stained his cottage.

JB: When did you do that in relation to the first time that you met him? How long?

█ A couple years.

JB: Oh, a couple years like that.

█ Yeah.

JB: Um, when you were hauling the brush the first time, what was that, that was out in the woods?

█ Yeah, there was piles. (inaudible) piles out in the woods and some of them he had me put you know the lawn.

JB: What was that from?

[REDACTED] Out in the woods.

JB: Yeah I know, but had they been doing a logging operation out there?

[REDACTED] No he wanted to clear out cause he wanted nothing but white birches.

JB: Did you have a chain saw or did you have a saw?

[REDACTED] No clippers, clippers.

JB: Clippers.

[REDACTED] Clippers. It was only nothing

JB: Yeah, small saplings.

[REDACTED] And the stuff that was dead had fallen down. You know because he wanted white birches.

JB: Was there leaves on these, the brush and stuff like that? I mean you know was it, was it.

[REDACTED] We're trying to figure out a time of the year maybe.

[REDACTED] They were dead. It was summer. It was summer.

JB: It was summer, but everything was dead?

[REDACTED] The stuff that was on the ground.

JB: Oh, okay. The stuff that was there, but you remember it being summer the first time that you were there?

[REDACTED] Huh, huh.

JB: Cause I know you had said that you were wearing shorts and

[REDACTED] Huh, huh.

JB: And ah.

[REDACTED] I couldn't (inaudible)

JB: And that he was wearing shorts.

[REDACTED] (inaudible) down the road. Later on down the road he wouldn't let me wear shorts.

JB: Why's that?

[REDACTED] Cause I couldn't get in the tub thing.

JB: Oh, yeah, yeah. So what did the house look like as you remember from the first time that you were there, the inside of the house what did it look like?

[REDACTED] He walked in a different door. The first time I was there the door was on a different side of the building.

JB: Huh, huh.

[REDACTED] And later on down the road they had that renovated.

JB: Hum.

[REDACTED] Had that, they, they, there was just like you walk in and you walk into a little, tinny kitchen.

JB: Huh, huh.

[REDACTED] And then you go in and there's just a living room thing. Bathroom off to the left and a (inaudible) That's all that existed when I first went there.

JB: Everything was finished and everything was established?

[REDACTED] Yeah.

JB: Did he have a couch in there? What did he have for furniture?

[REDACTED] He had a couch.

JB: Okay. Did he have a TV?

[REDACTED] Huh, huh. TV, VCR.

JB: Okay. Was any, was the TV ever on?

[REDACTED] Yeah.

JB: He had cable and everything and he was?

[REDACTED] I don't know about cable. I know he put in movies.

JB: Yeah, I remembered you had said that.

[REDACTED] (inaudible) any TV shows that may have been on. I mean if you were just watching TV.

JB: Had a phone and everything? Do you know if he had a phone there?

[REDACTED] Yes he had a phone. [REDACTED] something like that. I have it right maybe.

JB: Because I know you said that he used to call you. Right, isn't that how he set up to meet with you?

[REDACTED] Huh, huh.

JB: Again to have you come and do some work.

[REDACTED] I lived on [REDACTED] You need to trace that back. What time did I, when I lived in there.

JB: Yeah.

[REDACTED] Cause if I remember right we moved directly from [REDACTED] when my dad died up to [REDACTED]

JB: Do you know who the landlord was by any chance back then?

[REDACTED] (inaudible)

JB: Yep that's right.

[REDACTED] (inaudible)

JB: Yep.

[REDACTED] (inaudible) Uncle, brother.

JB: Huh, huh. Did you do work in the winter for him?

[REDACTED] No not a whole lot.

JB: Do you remember going over there in the winter time at all?

[REDACTED] Yeah. Later on I remember going there and pulling snow off the, the (inaudible)

JB: Okay. How long and we might have already went over this, but how long after when you guys first met um did he have the solarium and the jacuzzi in?

[REDACTED] Probably three years.

JB: Three years, okay. And so

[REDACTED] Three years yeah.

JB: Okay, so you would come over and, and that's when you would pull the glass was off the solarium?

[REDACTED] Pulling snow off.

JB: Pulling the snow.

[REDACTED] Right. Right. And it was (inaudible) or something because he had this big flowering planter groomed once a day and

JB: Huh, huh.

[REDACTED] And stuff like that.

JB: Okay.

[REDACTED] In the winter we would, (inaudible) we'd drink and drink. I know I can't blame him for my, my addictions.

JB: Huh, huh.

[REDACTED] And I can't because I was, everybody has a choice and eventually in life you have a choice. Pick up or don't want to pick up, right.

JB: Yeah.

[REDACTED] Just that I was kind of young then to understand the choice thing. I never really understood it until I was 32 years old.

JB: Listening to, to the tape ah we were listing to it some on the way down here, ah from our previous talk you had mentioned that a lot had happened to you then and you had gone through a lot in your life and you talked about your time in jail and you talked about YDC. You mentioned YDC. We didn't talk

about YDC at all then the first interview. Um, why don't you tell us about YDC and, and ah your time how often you were there and things that.

[REDACTED] I think in commitment there. Cause back then there was a 6 month commit, you were committing to (inaudible) and after you do a certain amount of time and I, I got sent there for the [REDACTED] ry thing. I broke into [REDACTED] being under 18. (inaudible)

JB: Do you remember when that was? This isn't the first time you went to YDC?

[REDACTED] I got arrested for it. Yeah that was my first time ever going to jail was for that.

JB: And your, your recollection about meeting Father Cote, was that before or after that time?

[REDACTED] After.

JB: So you met Father Cote after the first time that you'd gone to YDC?

[REDACTED] Huh, huh.

JB: And then you said you went again?

[REDACTED] I believe so.

JB: And um.

[REDACTED] Because my mom because she couldn't handle me.

JB: So she, she, they release her in your, ah you in her custody or something like that or placed her with you?

[REDACTED] (inaudible)

JB: They furloughed you to her. And um, how long then were you with her?

[REDACTED] (inaudible)

JB: And then did they eventually place you with her or did they place you somewhere else?

[REDACTED] Yeah, they let me back out with her.

JB: And how long.

█ Father Cote was like two years, almost two years if this helps before we got in the car accident.

JB: Almost two years before the car accident?

█ Yeah. (inaudible)

JB: Oh, before that car accident.

█ Before that, that was I think I was 16 then.

JB: Um.

█ 15, 16 when that happened.

JB: So after you, how long after you're furloughed do you, do you meet with Father Cote? About how long a period of time you think?

█ I don't know.

JB: You would have just come home then. It's a substantial time layer that, that you

█ About a year.

JB: About a year after you are furloughed.

█ When you, when you're um between your abuse and substances on a daily basis, the whole, the whole thing about time (inaudible) into that.

JB: Huh, huh.

█ And I, and I did I (inaudible) in years. It's like, and they told me this would happen when I got (inaudible) it's like you're being born again. It feels like a new born baby cause now you're seeing things, even the trees look different.

JB: Huh, huh.

█ You know it's like I'd never believe what I do today because (inaudible) you know.

JB: I just, I want to touch on something you just said. Um, you said Father Cote was two years after you gotten into the car accident with the guys there. Who, who are the two guys you got into the accident with?

[REDACTED] (inaudible) [REDACTED]

JB: Where was that?

[REDACTED] Where?

JB: Yeah.

[REDACTED] Somewhere between Exeter down on the seacoast, Hampton.

JB: Was that the real bad accident that [REDACTED] had?

[REDACTED] We got (inaudible)

JB: He got hurt really bad in that right?

[REDACTED] Yep, had his head. [REDACTED] got hurt too because he went face first through the windshield.

JB: You said you were 16 or 17 at the time?

[REDACTED] 15 or 16.

JB: 15 or 16.

[REDACTED] My mother would remember because she has she didn't let me leave the hospital when I (inaudible) conscientiousness. Had stitches all the way down my head and my arms.

JB: Wow. I remember that accident. I remember hearing about that accident.

[REDACTED] They never charged him for the coke or the pot or the tequila.

JB: Yeah.

[REDACTED] From the accident. I remember the drugs never got charged for. (inaudible) coma for a year and a half.

JB: Yeah. What road was that on? Do you know?

[REDACTED] Coming out of Hampton on the interstate. It was the interstate.

JB: 101?

[REDACTED] I think it was 93 maybe cause they brought me to Concord Hospital.

JB: Okay. So you said.

[REDACTED] Conscientiousness in a coma.

JB: So after this, so after this accident takes place you said then, then you met Father Cote about two years after that?

[REDACTED] (inaudible)

JB: Is that what you said?

[REDACTED] About a year. You know I believe I knew him before that though.

JB: Okay.

[REDACTED] (inaudible) Years and years of substance abuse will affect you.

JB: Um, I know you said you could only meet with us for a few minutes and so we don't want to hold you up. For one thing that ah we'd like to do if it's all right by you is ask you to sign a ah, an authorization for us. Actually I have two of them. One is an authorization for us to ah speak with anybody from [REDACTED] about when you left school and, and anything like that about records and things like that. Um, I'll let you take a look at that. Just a hand written one. We didn't have time enough when we were coming up with the car. We wanted to get right up here for you. Um, it's just so that we can look back and find out any dates that you may or may not have been at school. And ah why don't you just sign right down below there if you would. Just print your name underneath it. The other one I, I typed up before I ah we came down here and this is for [REDACTED] so that we can look at any records that may be at [REDACTED] Okay. Thank you [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] I started counseling tomorrow with ah Town Family Services.

JB: Oh yeah.

[REDACTED] I work for \$40.00 a week. The other one was \$200.00.

JB: What's that going to do now?

[REDACTED] Help me deal with this.

JB: Child and Family Services you said?

[REDACTED] NH Town & Family Services.

JB: Huh, huh.

Because without insurance it's expensive.

JB: Oh yeah

That's why, to have my tooth pulled I (inaudible)

JB: Yeah.
