Driscoll Celebrates 50th Year

The Rev. Joseph H. Driscoll, C.S.S.R., 77, of New Smyrna Beach, ordained on June 17, 1922, in Esopus, N.Y., by Cardinal James Hayes, will offer a mass of thanksgiving for his golden jubilee of priesthood May 14, at 4 p.m. in Sacred Heart Church.

His two brothers, Fathers Stanley and Harold, also Redemptorists, will celebrate the mass with him.

Trained in the Redemptorist Seminary of St. Alphonsus, Esopus, Father Driscoll was a chaplain at the U.S. Naval Academy, Annapolis, early in his career. He also served as assistant in South Carolina, Washington, D.C., Pennsylvania and Massachusetts.

He has held pastorships in Holy Trinity, Orangeburg, S.C., Sacred Heart, New Smyrna Beach, from 1939 to 1945; St. Joseph, Dalton, Ga.; and St. Alphonsus, New York, N.Y.

From 1950 to 1956 he served as vice provincial of the Richmond province.

THE PROJECT, tentatively entitled Discovery Weekend, is geared to sophomore and junior high school students, their pastors and high school guidance counselors.

The conference is designed to sort out the personality traits, aptitudes and skills of the young people involved as preparation for future education and occupations.

FEATURED IN the program will be testing evaluations, group and individual conferences and pastor-counselor instructions in how to deal with vocational guidance problems.

Area pastors involved are the Rev. Richard J. Milham, Powers Drive; the Rev. Girod Cole, College Park, and Dr. Henry Parker, First Baptist.
