Rev. Charles Demblowski, retired priest

The Rev. Charles E. Demblowski, a retired Roman Catholic priest, died of a heart attack Wednesday in Wheeling Medical Park.

Father Demblowski, 70, had been pastor of Our Lady of Perpetual Help Church in Natrona Heights between 1958 and 1971, at St. Joseph Church in O'Hara between 1971 and 1983 and at St. Joachim Church in Greenfield from 1983 until his retirement in 1985.

Previously, he had served as an assistant pastor at St. Ladislaus Church in Natrona; St. Francis Xavier Church, North Side; and St. Paul Cathedral in Oakland.

He was Newman Club chaplain at the University of Pittsburgh and Chatham College between 1955 and 1958.

A native of the South Side, he was ordained June 6, 1943, after his graduation from St. Vincent Seminary, Latrobe.

He is survived by a sister, Martha Cotter of the South Side; and three brothers, Paul of Carrick, Joseph of Castle Shannon and Marty of Whitehall.

Mr. Morgan, 78, of Squirrel Hill, received the Abe Banchek Award for outstanding service from the Zionist Organization of America in 1985. He was once membership chairman of the group.

He was a life member of the Men's Club of Poale Zedeck Congregation and a member of the Jewish War Veterans, Kether Torah Congregation, B'nai B'rith and Syria Temple.

He was an Army veteran of World War II.

He is survived by his wife, Rose; a daughter, Elaine Siegel of Marblehead, Mass.; a son, Steve of the South Hills; and three brothers: Israel of Squirrel Hill, Samuel of Silver

Spring, Md., and Calvin of South Hills.

Mr. Esterberg was a member of a barbershop quartet that sang on KDKA and KQV in the early days of radio.

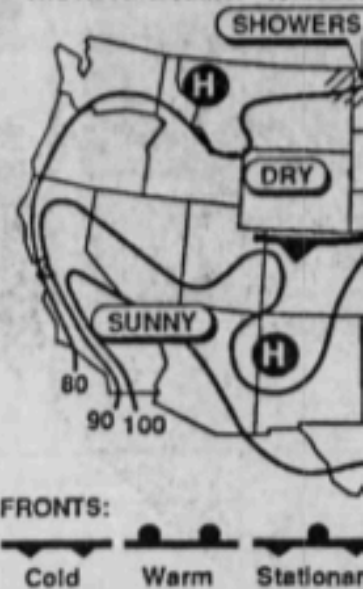
He was the winner of the J.L. Kraft Merit Award for public speaking and operated a restaurant in Florida for a time. He was a member of several Masonic organizations.
